Homework in 1st Class

Homework should take no longer than 15-20 minutes. Please supervise your child to stay on task during homework time. For some children the amount of completed homework expected will vary. Please contact the class teacher if your child is experiencing difficulty.

- **Spelling workbook** (3/4 per night). Please follow the "Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check" procedure.
- **Mental Maths**. Concepts will be covered over the course of the year. If your child cannot complete a question allow them to skip it and ask the teacher in class.
- **Guided reading book.** The children get 3-4 pages to read out loud per night. It would support your child's reading if you use the comprehension questions at the back of the book.
- Tricky words/ Tables: Later in the year, learning of tricky words and tables will be introduced to homework also.

What's new in the 1st Class Curriculum?

- Maths Introduction of tens and units during the year. Mathematical language used is renaming not "carrying the ten". Introduction to the 100 square. Rote learning of addition and subtraction tables.
- <u>Homework-</u> Homework will be taken down from the board into the homework journal.
- English Emphasis on cursive writing.
 Dictation will be introduced this year.
 Children will participate in Literacy Lift Off (LLO) to focus on reading fluency, accuracy and comprehension skills. Spellings will be checked every Friday.
- <u>AISTEAR-</u> Aistear (learning through play) will continue in 1st class.
- <u>Pencil Cases:</u> Please regularly check with your child to ensure that they have everything that they need. *E.g Pencils, Red pen, twistables, eraser, sharpener etc.*

Literacy


Children will bring home individual Oxford readers for most of the year. Please listen to your child reading aloud for a few minutes each evening and ask a few questions! Talk to your child about the characters, setting, problem, solution, cause and effect, sequence of events and fact or opinion.

Literacy Lift Off During term 1, the children will engage in differentiated reading and writing activities in a small group setting during LLO.

Children's spellings are checked every week with an emphasis on dictation and the ability to form sentences.
