## What's new in the 5th Class Curriculum?

### Maths:

Fractions, Decimals, Percentages and very important in 5<sup>th</sup> class. These topics integrate with all other topics e.g. money, length, weight etc. Long division is a tricky concept which requires the children to have a strong knowledge of their tables.

Problem solving becomes more complex in 5<sup>th</sup> class.

A high standard of presentation is expected of the children in 5<sup>th</sup> class along with more personal responsibility for homework and belongings.

#### Irish:

We are using the Irish scheme Seo Leat. The children have dictionary copies for Irish where they record key words and phrases.

### Spellings this year

Word Study is our new approach to spellings.
We use the new Jolly Grammar books as a
guide but classes explore how words are
spelled rather than learning off for a test.
Dictation will mainly be used for assessment. A
hardback copy is used to complete all Word
Study activities.
