Homework in 6th Class

Homework in 6th class shouldn't take longer than **an hour.** We always expect children to make their **best effort** when completing homework and to **talk to the teachers** if they are having difficulty with it. Homework will sometimes be **project-based** with a usual completion time of one to two weeks.

A high standard of **presentation** (both written and oral) is expected of the children in 6th class along with more **personal responsibility** for homework and belongings.

Uniform

Please ensure that your child is wearing the full correct uniform, which includes tie and black shoes. Runners can be worn with tracksuit.

What's new in the 6th Class Curriculum?

Maths:

Fractions, Decimals, Percentages are very important in 6th class. These topics integrate with all other topics- money, length, weight etc. **Problem solving** becomes more complex in 6th class. We encourage children to practice them as much as possible.

<u>Gaeilge</u>

We try to make the learning of Gaeilge as fun and as interactive as possible in 6th Class through art, poetry, games, conversation and writing. We encourage the informal use of Gaeilge as much as possible in the classroom and at home in order to improve children's confidence and fluency with our national language.

We are using a new Irish scheme in SNU. The books are part of book rental. The children have dictionary copies for Irish where they record key words and phrases.

The children learn a verb each week. They need to learn the Aimsir Caite, Aimsir Láithreach and Aimsir Fháistineach.

Literacy

As we are restricting the movement of books between school and home, we will be reading our **novels** in school. We will apply the **Guided Reading** strategies to our novels this year to continue improving reading **fluency** and **comprehension** in 6th Class.

We would encourage all children to reduce screen time and increase reading for pleasure at home, be it a novel or appropriate newspaper etc. Please spend some time each evening listening to your children **reading out loud** and engage them in conversation about their reading material.

Classes are split into table groups. Each group has the opportunity to win points based on positive behaviour, a good attitude towards learning and organisational skills. The winning group at the end of each week gets to choose a reward, such as a homework pass.
