Aistear Programme



In Junior Infants we partake in Aistear which is learning through play. Each fortnight we begin a new theme, for example the post office and the clothes shop. Aistear helps develop oral language, imagination and social skills which are essential for junior infant pupils.

Phonics

Children will begin learning phonics in November. It is very important that the sounds are practised every night when they are sent home to consolidate learning. We will upload an instructional video to Google Classroom to explain how it works.

Maths

In Junior Infants, the children focus on early mathematical skills such as classifying, sorting, matching and ordering items. Along with these skills, children will also explore number work, patterns, shape and measure.

Fostering Independence

As the children are now in Junior Infants, it is important that the children are able to do the following independently:

- Take off and put on their own coats, jumpers and gloves.
- Open and close their school bags.
- Open and close their lunch boxes and drinks.
- Peel oranges and open yogurts/packets independently.

If your child is unable to do any of the above, we would appreciate it if you could practice these skills at home.
